EXERCISE OPENING STATEMENTS

Background

You're on a litigation team. You're defending your client, SafeHome, from a class action lawsuit alleging that their product, a home monitoring system, was defective and failed to alert the homeowners to dangerous conditions in their homes. SafeHome is a large company that was founded a decade ago by a couple whose home was destroyed by a fire.

Your client is adamant that the systems were not defective, but instead, were altered by the plaintiffs. These alterations were an unintended use of the systems, causing them to malfunction. In fact, the warrantees covering the systems were indisputably voided by the plaintiffs' actions. Both sides, however, have experts opining on the defects and the cause of the malfunction in the systems. You largely expect that the trial will be a battle of the experts.

Your team is in the middle of preparing for the trial. You're meeting tomorrow to discuss a plan for opening statements.
